**AYUSH MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS AND AYUSH WELLNESS CENTRES IN
RAJASTHAN**

Will the Minister of AYUSH be pleased to state:

- (a) the current number of AYUSH medical institutions and AYUSH wellness centres in Rajasthan;
- (b) the financial assistance provided by the Central Government during the last three years;
- (c) the number of new institutions sanctioned; and
- (d) the plan formulated to promote AYUSH medical tourism?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH

- (a) As reported by State Government of Rajasthan, there are currently 23 Ayush medical institutions and 2019 Ayush Health and wellness centres now renamed as Ayushman Arogya Mandir (Ayush) in Rajasthan.
- (b) Under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of the National Ayush Mission (NAM), the Ministry of Ayush has released a total grant-in-aid of Rs. 27,999.962 lakh as Central Share during the last three years for the implementation of various activities approved under the State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) submitted by the State Government of Rajasthan.
- (c) Under NAM, as per the proposals received from State Government of Rajasthan through SAAPs, one new Ayush Educational institution, Chaksu, Jaipur has been approved/sanctioned for establishment.
- (d) The Government promotes Medical Value Travel (MVT) through Ayush under a pan-India framework, which includes the National Strategy and Roadmap for Medical and Wellness Tourism, introduction of the Ayush Visa (M-3) and Ayush Attendant Visa (M-4), implementation of the Central Sector Scheme for Promotion of International Cooperation for Ayush, promotion of National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare Providers

(NABH)-accredited Ayush hospitals and wellness centres, launch of the Ayush Quality Mark, operationalisation of Standard Treatment Guidelines (STGs), international academic collaborations and scholarships, establishment of the Ayurveda Training Accreditation Board (ATAB) and Yoga Certification Board (YCB), collaboration with the India Tourism Development Corporation (ITDC), and organization of Ayush-based Medical Value Travel Summits to promote India as a preferred destination for Ayush-based healthcare and wellness services.
