**IMPLEMENTATION OF CENTRAL HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE SCHEMES
IN J & K**

2671 SHRI GULAM ALI:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government will provide district-wise details of implementation of Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) SEHAT, National Health Mission (NHM), PM-Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM), eSanjeevani, Mission Indradhanush and Nikshay in Jammu and Kashmir (J & K) during the last five years;
- (b) the beneficiaries, hospitals upgraded, Health and Wellness Centres operational, funds allocated, released and utilised, district-wise;
- (c) the districts with implementation delays and reasons therefor; and
- (d) the corrective measures and timelines for universal healthcare coverage across all districts?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE
(SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV)**

(a) to (d) 'Public Health and Hospitals' is a state subject and the implementation of the programmes comes under the jurisdiction of the State/UT Government.

Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri - Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) is a flagship scheme of the Government which provides health cover of Rs.5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization to approximately 55 Crore beneficiaries corresponding to 12.37 Crore families constituting economically vulnerable bottom 40% of India's population. Recently, the scheme has been expanded to cover 6 crore senior citizens of age 70 years and above belonging to 4.5 crore families irrespective of their socio-economic status under AB PM-JAY with Vay Vandana Card.

As reported by the State Health Agency, Jammu and Kashmir (J&K), Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana has been implemented in convergence with Ayushman Bharat PM-JAY SEHAT. A total of 25 lakh families are covered in the UT of J&K, of which 6.70 lakh families are covered under AB PM-JAY, while the remaining eligible families are covered exclusively by the AB PM-JAY SEHAT. The district-wise details of hospital admissions authorised under PM-JAY for the last five years (FY 2021-22 to FY 2025-26) are given at **Annexure I**.

The National Health Mission (NHM) provides support for improvement in healthcare infrastructure, availability of adequate human resources in health facilities, to improve availability and accessibility to quality healthcare across the country including the U.T. of Jammu and Kashmir. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) provides technical and financial support to the States/UTs including the U.T. of Jammu and Kashmir to strengthen the public healthcare system, based on the proposals received in the form of Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) under NHM. Government of India provides approval for the proposals in the form of Record of Proceedings (RoPs) as per norms and available resource envelope.

The Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) with an outlay of Rs.64,180 crore aims to provide support for infrastructure development for Sub-Health Centres (SHC), Urban Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (U-AAM), Support for Block Public Health Units (BPHU), Integrated District Public Health Laboratories (IPHL) and Critical Care Hospital Blocks (CCBs) in the country.

The details of Central Funds released under the National Health Mission (NHM) and Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) to the UT of Jammu and Kashmir during the last five years from FY 2021-22 to 2025-26 are given below:

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) has implemented eSanjeevani service in all States/UTs in the country including the U.T. of Jammu and Kashmir. As on 31 July 2026, eSanjeevani has served over 48.9 crores patients across the nation. The service is operational through a vast network of 1,41,368 health facilities (spokes), supported by 19264 hubs and 776 online OPDs, ensuring seamless access to quality healthcare even in the most remote regions. The district-wise Teleconsultations provided in the U.T. of Jammu and Kashmir is given at **Annexure – II**.

The details of Intensified Mission Indradhanush rounds held in the past 5 years in the U.T. of Jammu and Kashmir is given in **Annexure - III**.

The Government has implemented TB Mukht Bharat Abhiyan under the aegis of National Health Mission (NHM) across all the States/UTs in the country including the U.T. of Jammu and Kashmir. The key strategies includes identification of symptomatic / asymptomatic vulnerable population, screening by Chest X-ray for early detection, upfront Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (NAAT) for all presumptive TB cases, timely treatment initiation and completion, differentiated TB care for management of high-risk TB cases, nutrition support and preventive treatment to eligible vulnerable population. The district wise

TB cases notified from Jammu & Kashmir in last five years, as reported on Ni-kshay portal under TB Mukht Bharat Abhiyan are placed as **Annexure - IV**.
