**FEEDBACK ON INDIA'S ZERO-TERROR DIPLOMACY**

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state

- (a) the feedback received from key capitals including the US, UK, France, Germany, Israel and Japan following the visits by seven parliamentary delegations to 33 countries propagating India's zero-terror tolerance post-Operation Sindoor;
- (b) the areas of active cooperation endorsed such as security partnerships, counter-terrorism collaboration, or FATF coordination cited by foreign interlocutors; and
- (c) the measures undertaken by the Ministry to collate, analyse and integrate this foreign feedback into India's future counter-terror diplomacy and multilateral advocacy?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (c) Seven all-party delegations visited 33 countries in the aftermath of Operation Sindoor and conveyed India's strong national consensus and resolute approach to combating terrorism in all its forms and manifestations. The host countries strongly condemned the Pahalgam terror attack and expressed solidarity with India in its fight against the menace of cross-border terrorism. In line with India's zero-tolerance approach to terrorism, it was reaffirmed that there can be no justification for terrorism. The host countries were also briefed on India's "new normal" against Pakistan-backed cross-border terrorism. Hon'ble Prime Minister and the External Affairs Minister met the all-party delegation members upon their return and took note of their impressions and suggestions.

The host governments expressed their commitment to maintain close cooperation with India on all matters relating to combating terrorism, including proscribing of terrorists, and blocking the channels of terror-financing. It is notable that on 18 July 2025, the terrorist group "The Resistance Front" was designated as a Foreign Terrorist Organisation (FTO) and as a Specially Designated Global Terrorist (SDGT) by the US. Similarly, the 36th UNSC 1267 Sanctions Committee Monitoring report dated 24 July 2025 made reference to TRF's links to the Pahalgam terrorist attack.

The condemnation of the Pahalgam terror attack was also reflected in outcome documents at various bilateral engagements as well as multilateral fora, including the UNSC Press Statement of 25 April 2025, 4th India-Central Asia Foreign Ministers' Dialogue on 06 June 2025, the FATF Public Document on 16 June 2025, the Joint Statement of QUAD Foreign Ministers Meeting on 01 July 2025 and the BRICS Leaders' Summit Declaration on 06 July 2025.

India continues to engage with the international community to further strengthen counter-terrorism cooperation through institutional mechanisms like the Counter-Terrorism Joint Working Groups set up with 31 countries (which include some of these 33 countries) and 6 multilateral groupings.

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
