SOLAR AND WIND ENERGY-BASED POWER PROJECTS

304. SHRI MADAN RATHORE

Will the Minister of NEW AND RENEWABLE ENERGY be pleased to state:

- (a) the financial assistance provided by the Central Government during the last three years for solar and wind energy-based power projects in Rajasthan;
- (b) the current installed solar and wind energy capacity in the State;
- (c) the details of newly sanctioned projects; and
- (d) the direct and indirect employment opportunities estimated to be generated from these projects?

ANSWER

- (a) The details of financial assistance provided by the Government during the last three years for solar and wind energy-based power projects in Rajasthan are as under:

- (b) The current installed solar and wind energy capacity in the State, as on 30.06.2026 are 43,317.81 MW and 5,516.04 MW respectively.
- (c) The details of solar and wind projects sanctioned under various schemes of the Government are in **Annexure**.
- (d) As per the Full Time Equivalent coefficients derived from the study on “Driving Energy Transition - Work force, Skills and Gender in India’s Renewable Energy Sector” carried out by Council on Energy, Environment and Water, the employment opportunities generated from the current installed solar and wind energy projects is estimated to be around 2.13 lakhs.

Details of solar and wind projects sanctioned in Rajasthan

- (i) Under the CPSU Scheme Phase-II, around 8.1 GW of Grid Connected Solar Photovoltaic (PV) Power Projects have been awarded since 2019 to various Government entities. The projects awarded under the Scheme can be set up anywhere in the country, including Rajasthan.
- (ii) PM-KUSUM is a demand-driven scheme, funds and capacities are allocated based on the demand raised by the state and milestones achieved.
- (iii) The PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana (PMSG: MBY) is also a demand driven scheme wherein all residential consumers in the country, having grid connected electricity connection of the local DISCOM can avail the benefits of the scheme, for installation of RTS systems, by applying on the National Portal of the scheme.
- (iv) Under the scheme for “Development of Solar Parks and Ultra Mega Solar Power Projects”, 11 nos. of solar parks of aggregate capacity 10,726 MW have been sanctioned.
- (v) At present, there is no scheme for providing financial subsidy/incentive for installation of wind power projects. The wind power projects are being installed by private companies/public sector enterprises based on techno-economic assessment. Accordingly, no new wind project is sanctioned.
