IMPLEMENTATION OF PMGSY IN HARYANA

790 Shri Sanjay Bhatia:

Will the Minister of Rural Development be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of new rural roads constructed and upgraded in Haryana during the year 2025–26, and the number of habitations that were provided all-weather road connectivity under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY);
- (b) whether Government has any proposal under PMGSY-IV to provide better road connectivity to the remaining eligible villages, agricultural markets, and rural industrial areas in Haryana, if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the amount of central assistance approved for road construction, upgradation, and maintenance under PMGSY in Haryana during the year 2026–27 and the districts that have been given priority?

ANSWER

(a): Under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) since scheme inception, a total of 773 roads of 8,111 km length have been sanctioned with a total cost of Rs. 3718 crore to the State of Haryana. The State has completed all the sanctioned projects under all verticals of PMGSY by FY 2024-25. However, as per the maintenance policy of the Ministry under PMGSY, the State is currently performing maintenance works of already completed roads under PMGSY.

(b): At present, road projects are being sanctioned under the new phase of PMGSY-IV, launched in September 2024. In this new phase, States/UTs are required to survey eligible habitations for which new connectivity is to be provided under PMGSY-IV. However, the State of Haryana has not surveyed any eligible habitations as per the eligibility criteria outlined in the PMGSY-IV guidelines. As far as connectivity to agricultural markets and other facility centres is concerned, a total of 16,441 facility centres, including agriculture, medical, education and transport facilities, have been connected under PMGSY.

(c): In the current financial year, the central government has released Rs. 36.05 crore which includes administrative fund and incentive fund (reimbursement of release in last FY 2025-26, which remained unutilised by the state) to the state of Haryana to carry out maintenance works on roads that have already been constructed under PMGSY. Under this scheme, funds are provided to the state as a whole, allocation and disbursement among the districts is done by the state.
