Financial assistance to Ayush institutions under Ayurgyan scheme in Haryana

Will the Minister of Ayush be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any research project or financial assistance has been sanctioned to AYUSH institutions, universities and research centres in Haryana under the AYURGYAN Scheme and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether Government has any proposal to establish an All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA) or a Centre of Excellence in Haryana to strengthen Ayurveda research, education and integrated healthcare services and if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) whether Government has formulated any special action plan to expand the integrated healthcare model of AYUSH and modern medicine and promote Ayurveda-based research and treatment facilities in Haryana and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH

(a) The Ministry of Ayush is implementing a Central Sector Scheme namely Ayurgyan since 2021-22 with the aim to support Research & Innovation in Ayush by providing extra mural research activities and education by providing academic activities, training, capacity building etc. The Scheme has 03 components viz. (i) Capacity Building & Continuing Medical Education (CME) in Aysuh (ii) Research & Innovation (R&I) in Ayush from FY 2021-22 and 3rd component namely Ayurveda Biology Integrated Health Research (ABIHR) was also added under the scheme from FY 2023-24.

Under the scheme, financial assistance amounting to Rs.36.00 lakhs were provided to the Ayush institutions to conduct four (6-days) training programme for the Ayush personnel.

(b) There is no proposal under consideration to establish an All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA) or a Centre of Excellence in Ayush in the State.

(c) To promote Integrative Health Research, a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) was signed between the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the Ministry of Ayush on 11th May 2023. Further under Ayush-ICMR collaboration, the study titled “Efficacy and safety of Punarnavadi Mandura alone and in combination with Drakshavaleha compared to iron and folic acid in the treatment of moderate iron deficiency anaemia among non-pregnant women of reproductive age group: a community-based three arm multicenter randomized controlled trial” has been completed. One of the study sites for this multicentre clinical trial was the Expansion Unit of AIIMS, New Delhi, at Ballabhgarh in the State of Haryana.

Further, to expand the integrated healthcare model of Ayush and modern medicine, the mainstreaming of Ayush is a core strategy under the National Health Mission (NHM) to provide accessible, affordable, and quality healthcare. To promote traditional systems of medicine, the Government has integrated Ayush services into the public healthcare system through the co-location of Ayush facilities at Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs), and District Hospitals (DHs). This initiative is being implemented across India, including in the State of Haryana, to promote traditional systems of medicine and strengthen the delivery of integrated healthcare.
