- (b) if so, the details thereof along with terms of reference of the Committee;
- (c) whether the Committee has submitted its report and the Government has adopted a new methodology for the calculation of GDP and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the timeframe by which the methodology is likely to be fully adopted?

**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 114\* REGARDING “METHODOLOGY FOR CALCULATING GDP” RAISED BY SHRI MALLIKARJUN KHARGE DUE FOR ANSWER ON 23<sup>rd</sup> NOVEMBER, 2016.**

(a) & (b): Yes, Madam. The Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI) has a regular advisory mechanism in the form of an Advisory Committee on National Accounts Statistics (ACNAS) comprising eminent economists, statisticians and other experts to look into and advise on all methodological aspects for compilation and presentation of GDP estimates and estimates of other national accounts aggregates. The ACNAS is constituted from time to time in consultation with the National Statistical Commission. The terms of reference of the ACNAS are:

1. To review the data base and advise on data collection through sample surveys, type studies etc. for implementing the recommendations of the System of National Accounts – 2008 (SNA-2008);
2. To advice on the methodology for compilation and presentation of National Accounts Statistics for purposes of economic analysis and policy and on promotion of research in the field of National Accounts Statistics;
3. To advice on undertaking studies for improvement of National Accounts Statistics in terms of coverage, adoption of new classifications recommended by the United Nations Statistics Division to capture impact of recent policies/ efforts of the government and development of sequence of accounts for various institutional sectors;
4. To provide guidelines on the presentation of methodology document on National Accounts Statistics; Sources and Methods as per new series; and
5. To advice on any other matter referred to the Committee by the National Statistical Commission in respect of national accounts.

(c): The ACNAS, on the basis of the reports of the five sub-committees constituted by it, formulated methodology for revision of national accounts with new base year 2011-12. The reports of the sub-committees are available in the public domain through MOSPI’s website. Changes in methodology and data sources for implementation in the new series of national accounts with base year 2011-12 were reviewed and finalised in a joint meeting of the ACNAS and the National Statistical Commission held on 19-01-2015. The details of changes in methodology incorporated in the base revision exercise are mainly intended to comply with the guidelines under United Nations System of National Accounts -2008 and are available in the website of MOSPI.

(d): The methodology approved by the ACNAS has been used in the base revision exercise of national accounts to compile and present national accounts with base year 2011-12. The national accounts estimates with new base year 2011-12 were released on 30-01-2015.
