Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of trainees trained under various skill development schemes/ programmes annually during the last three years;
- (b) whether the Public Private Partnership exist to promote training in skill development centres across the country and if so, the cost incurred for the same;
- (c) the number of operational training centres that exists in the country;
- (d) the details of the participation required and the achievement made in realising the targets set under the 'Make in India' programme; and
- (e) whether the Government is formulating more scheme for skill development in rural areas and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI RAJIV PRATAP RUDY)

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 118 TO BE ANSWERED ON 23.11.2016 ASKED BY SHRIMATI POONAMBEN MAADAM REGARDING 'SKILL DEVELOPMENT'

- (a) Government is implementing more than 40 schemes through 20 different Ministries for providing a variety of skill development training programmes in the country. During last three years i.e 2015-16, 2014-15 and 2013-14, the number of trained persons (in lakhs) is 104.16, 76.11 and 76.37 respectively.
- (b) The Government has set up National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) under the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship as a Public private Partnership entity to promote private training providers to set up skill training centres across the Country. It is the nodal organization for all private sector initiatives in the short term skilling space. Its mandate to catalyze the creation of market-based skill development initiatives by providing funding through a combination of debt, equity and grants.
- (c) Under PMKVY (2015-16), 12,191 training centres trained candidates in short term training and 1042 training centres trained people under RPL respectively. With an aim to skill ten million youth over a period of four years under PMKVY (2016-2020), as on 13th November 2016, 118 centers have been allocated targets under short term training. Also, 12 Project Implementing Agency (PIA) under RPL and 5 PIAs under special projects have been allocated targets. Under NSDC fees based model, 4380 Centers (Included 443 mobile centers) are currently operational. There are around 13,000 Government Training Institutes (ITIs) to provide long term skill development training programmes. In the domain of long term training programme, Dual System of Training are imparted in the trades of Electrician, Fitter, Machinist, Turner, Electronics Mechanic, Welder, Mechanic Diesel, Mechanic (Motor Vehicle), Cosmetology and Tool & Die Maker (Dies & Moulds).
- (d) Under PMKVY 2015-16, 7,21,597 candidates have been trained in manufacturing job roles which can be considered as a support to 'Make in India' initiative. State-wise details of the number of candidates trained under manufacturing job role are given at **Annexure**.
- (e) Yes Madam, Government accorded the high priority for socio- economic growth of rural areas. Skill Development schemes of the government ensure inclusivity for safeguard the skilling needs of people in difficult geographical/rural areas. Government has launched flagship Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY (2016 2020) for providing short-term skill training on pan- India basis. Scheme aims to skill 10 million youths under Short Term Training, RPL and Special Projects across the country including rural areas. Under the scheme, 18,01,936 candidates under Fresh Training and 1,80,511 for RPL have been trained during 2015-16. The block/Taluk level training centre under PMKVY have the immense access to rural areas for imparting skill training to grassroots people. Government is also implementing Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra (PMKK) for setting up skill centre at district/block level for imparting skill training in rural areas.
