(c): In order to increase production of oilseeds and hence edible oil and to make the country self-sufficient in edible oils, a National Mission on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) is being implemented in country since year-2014-15 by Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare. NMOOP comprise of three Mini-Mission (MM) viz MM-I (Oilseeds), MM-II (Oil Palm) and MM-III (Tree Borne Oils). Under the mission, assistance is being provided to farmers for various components/ interventions in order to increase oilseed production.
