#### 1042. SHRI A.P. JITHENDER REDDY:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT FORESTS AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has committed to increase the forest cover by five million hectares under the Paris agreement and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the measures being taken by the Government to fulfil its commitment; and
- (c) whether the Government has commenced steps to substantially reduce greenhouse gas emissions and if so, the details thereof?

## **ANSWER**

- (a) and (b) The Intended Nationally Determined Contribution (INDC) communicated by the Government of India before the Paris Agreement includes creation of an additional carbon sink of 2.5 to 3 billion tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> equivalent through additional forest and tree cover by 2030.

  Government of India implements several programmes to fulfill the above commitment, which include *inter alia* National Mission for a Green India, the National Afforestation Programme and the Compensatory Afforestation Programme. Programmes implemented by the State Governments also contribute to this goal.
- (c) The Government of India has initiated several measures to reduce the green house gas emissions and promote clean energy which include, *inter alia* increasing the share of non-fossil fuel based energy sources to 40 % of the cumulative electric power installed capacity, promotion of solar energy by setting up a target of 175 GW of solar power by 2022, enhancement of energy efficiency through Perform Achieve Trade (PAT) scheme and promotion of Light Emitting Diode (LED) bulbs *etc*.
