(a) & (b): In line with the bi-decennial cycle (1976, 1996 and 2016), the United Nations General Assembly had convened the 3<sup>rd</sup> United Nation Conference on Housing & Sustainable Urban Development, known as Habitat III during 17<sup>th</sup> -

20<sup>th</sup> October, 2016 at Quito, Ecuador and the 'New Urban Agenda' – Quito Declaration on Sustainable Cities and Human Settlements for All was adopted on 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2016.

The new urban agenda outlines the upcoming challenges and opportunities of growing urbanization which can be addressed through planning, design, finance, development, governance and management, guided by the New Urban Agenda.

(c): The India Habitat-III National Report, 2016 outlines the way forward towards achieving sustainable human settlements in India. In addition, a number of urban missions have been launched by the Government of India to address the challenges of urbanization and to tap the vast opportunities and potential that urbanization offers.
