(a to d) The Government has already implemented several new programmes to promote new methods for improving the productivity and profitability in the agriculture. Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana (PMKSY) which embarks upon 'per drop more crop' has been implemented to enhance the water use efficiency. Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) is implemented to cover the risk of crop failure and minimise the monetary loss to the farmers. Similarly, Paramparagat Krisahi Vikas Yojana and Organic Value Chain for North Eastern Region and Soil Health Cards Scheme are under implementation to promote organic farming and maintain soil health, respectively. To promote electronic mode of transactions of agricultural commodities, the electronic National Agriculture Market (eNAM) has been launched on 14th April, 2016.

(e & f) The NITI Aayog has suggested an index called Agricultural Marketing and Farmer Friendly Reforms Index (AMFFRI) to sensitise the States to bring reforms in agriculture. These market reforms are aimed to promote competition, efficiency, transparency, and removal of regulatory restrictions having adverse effect on producers. These reforms indicate the ease of doing agribusiness and range of choices and options granted to producers to sell his produce on a better price.
