Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES, RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND GANGA REJUVENATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has undertaken certain works through lift irrigation on Gittal-Sand Irrigation Project and Swarna Rekha Multipurpose Irrigation Project;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR WATER RESOURCES, RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND GANGA REJUVENATION (DR. SANJEEV KUMAR BALYAN)

(a) to (c) Water Resources projects are planned, funded, executed and maintained by the State Governments themselves as per their own resources and priorities. In order to supplement the efforts of the State Governments, Government of India provides technical and financial assistance to them to encourage sustainable development and efficient management of water resources through various schemes and programmes such as Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme (AIBP); and scheme for Repair, Renovation and Restoration (RRR) of water bodies etc. as per the guidelines of these schemes.

Subarnarekha Multipurpose irrigation project of Jharkhand State is getting central assistance under AIBP. As per information provided by State Government, it is proposed to provide irrigation in 12565 ha of Culturable Command Area (CCA) through Lift Irrigation as per details given below:
