- (a) to (c): Responsibility of Security of Industrial hub during peace time primarily rests with concerned State Government, except the Industries which are very sensitive and security audit of which is with Union Government. Government is aware of Security threat to these industries, particularly during hostilities, reviews the threat perception periodically and takes necessary measures from time to time.
- (d) & (e): Presently Coast Guard have already 42 Stations at such places. Out of these, 8 Coast Guard Stations are in Gujarat. Besides a Coast Guard Air Enclave and Coast Guard District Headquarter are functioning from Porbandar. Further, there is no plan for additional Coast Guard Station in near future.
