LEAD USED IN ENAMEL PAINTS

1741. SHRI PONGULETI SRINIVASA REDDY:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that exposure of children to lead, a highly toxic heavy metal used in enamel paints can affect their behavioural and cognitive development and a research by a section of Environmental Paediatrics at New York University School of Medicine has found that exposure to lead costs India US\$ 236 billion annually;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) the measures taken by the Government to create awareness about leadbased paints available in the market and impact of lead paints on health and environment?

(a) & (b): According to research done by Environmental Pediatrics at New York University School of Medicine, exposure to lead has a permanent negative impact on children's developing brains. One impact is a reduction in intelligence quotient (IQ), which can be correlated with decreases in lifetime earning potential. The results of the research are presented for Africa, Asia and Latin America/Caribbean following World Health Organisation geographic classifications (United Nations, 2012). Lead exposure represents a major contributor to children's intellectual disability in many Low and Middle Income Countries (LMICs), which in turn translates into significant earning losses over a lifetime. Childhood lead exposure in India, when translated into economic losses is estimated to be US\$236.1 billion.
