### Shortage of seats in IITs

#### 1861. SHRI NANDI YELLAIAH:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that a large number of students are deprived of the opportunity to get admission in Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) due to shortage of seats and faculty;
- (b) if so, whether the Government proposes to take remedial action in this regard; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

#### ANSWER

### MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MAHENDRA NATH PANDEY)

(a) to (c): Admission in IITs in various courses is done on the basis of merit in the admission tests such as Joint Entrance Examination (Advanced) [JEE (Advanced)], Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) and Joint Admission Test for M.Sc (JAM). However, the IIT-Council in its 50<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 23.08.2016 approved the proposal for increasing the overall students' strength in the IITs to one lakh by the year 2020. All IITs have been asked to prepare a plan of action for implementing this decision.
