Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the share of the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises(MSMEs) sector in the total industrial production in the country;
- (b) whether the Government has conducted any survey regarding growth of the MSME sector during of the last three years, if so, the details and the outcome thereof;
- (c) whether the development of MSME sector in the country is extremely negligible in comparison to the MSMEs of other countries particularly China, if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor; and
- (d) the corrective steps taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to boost the growth of the MSME sector?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI HARIBHAI PARATHIBHAI CHAUDHARY)

(a): As per the data available with Central Statistics Office (CSO), Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation, Government of India, the share of industrial Output for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) (manufacturing, construction and electricity, gas, water supply and remediation) for the year 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15 are, 38.51%, 38.33%, 38.51% and 38.85%, respectively, at current prices and the share of industrial output for 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15 excluding construction at constant prices are 23.00% 23.15% and 22.86%, respectively.

However, the CSO does not compile estimates (GVA/GVO) of MSME sector based on the definition of MSME sector. An approximation based on the results of Annual Survey of Industries (ASI) and surveys on unorganised sector has been made to arrive at the above contribution, as mentioned in the previous para. The estimates (GVO) of construction for the household part at constant prices are currently not being compiled by CSO and hence, the estimates at constant prices are exclusive of construction.

(b): No survey has been conducted by this Ministry regarding growth of the MSME sector during any of the last three years.

- (c): Comparable data on development of MSMEs of other countries are not maintained by the Ministry of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME).
- (d): The question of any corrective step doesn't arise in view of (c) above. However, all the promotional activities undertaken by the M/o MSME, Govt. of India are in pursuance of the MSME Development Act, 2006. All the schemes of the Ministry of MSME are geared towards promotion and development of the MSME sector and are designed to boost the growth of MSME sector.
