IMPACT OF SBM

No. 2506 SHRI M. MURALI MOHAN: SHRI R. DHRUVANARAYANA:

Will the Minister of URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of assessment survey carried out to measure the impact of the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) since its launch and the impact of the SBM State-wise;
- (b) whether the Government has considered focusing on behavioural changes rather than increasing access to toilets;
- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the alternative steps taken by the Government to eliminate open defecation; and
- (d) the names of the States that have failed/lagging behind in implementation of SBM?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT

(SHRI M. VENKAIAH NAIDU)

(a): There is a major impact of Swachh Bharat Mission since its launch. One of the objectives of the Mission is to make the country Open Defecation Free (ODF) with the construction of Individual Household Toilets (IHHTs) and Public & Community Toilets by 2nd October, 2019. The Mission covers all 4041 statutory towns/cities as per 2011 census for Municipal Solid Waste Management. During the implementation of SBM, all the State Governments have assessed the demand for IHHTs. The state-wise estimated target with no. of IHHTs and CT & PT constructed in urban areas is enclosed as Annexure-I

(b & c): A key strategy under SBM (Urban) is behaviour change communication to ensure that sanitation as an issue is mainstreamed with the general public at large and should cover issues of open defecation, prevention of manual scavenging, hygiene practices, proper use and maintenance of toilet facilities (household, community or otherwise), etc., and its related health and environmental consequences. MoUD and State Govts./UTs have taken the following initiatives for behavioural change:-

- (i) Citizen-Partnered thematic drives every fortnight.
- (ii) Intense Multi-media campaign titled "Asli Tarakki", targeting behaviour change towards Open Defecation Free (ODF) cities/towns.
- (iii) Intensive engagement with self-help groups and students to be change agents to drive behaviour change towards ODF.
- (iv) A detailed ODF protocol designed, monitoring "no OD" status, rather than number of toilets.
- (v) Third party certification of ODF claims of cities and states, to be renewed every 6 months.

(d) MoUD reviews the progress of Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) in States on a day-to-day basis and also on monthly basis through video conferences/teleconferences, meetings with State Mission Directors and also provide onsite technical assistance to effectively implement the Mission across the country. The names of the states lagging behind in implementation of SBM may be seen from Annexure-I.
