Will the Minister of DRINKING WATER AND SANITATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the amount of funds provided by the Union Government to Uttar Pradesh for drinking water and sanitation separately during each of the last three years andthe current year;
- (b) whether the said amount of funds were insufficient and if so, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the volume of work still remaining to be done in the said areas in the State?

(a) Under National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP), the amount of funds provided by this Ministry to Uttar Pradesh for drinking water during each of the last three years and current year is given as under:

Under Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) {SBM(G)}, the Central share release to Government of Uttar Pradesh, during the last 3 years and in the current year is as under:

- (b) Under National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP), this Ministry allocates funds to the States / UTs based on the pre-approved criteria which includes weightage for Rural population, Rural SC and ST population, States under Desert Development Programme(DDP), Drought Prone Area Programme(DPAP), Hill Area Development Programme (HADP) and special category Hill States in terms of rural areas and rural population managing rural drinking water supply schemes weighted by a Management Devolution Index(MDI). As per the same, State of Uttar Pradesh has been allocated its share of funds.
- (c) The status of coverage of rural habitations with drinking water supply in Uttar Pradesh as on 28.11.2016 as reported by the State in the Integrated Management Information System(IMIS) of the Ministry is as under:
