**EXPANSION OF AIRPORTS**

- (a) whether the Ministry has received any proposal regarding expansion and facelift of the Belgaum, Hubli and Mysore airports including expansion of runway, if so, the details thereof and the present status of the proposal;
- (b) whether the Airports Authority of India (AAI) has been able to acquire land required for the expansion of these airports and runways; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

(a) to (c): Yes, Madam. Airports Authority of India (AAI) has received 364 acres land at Belgaum, 588 acres land at Hubli and 142 acres land at Mysore from the State Govt. against the projected requirement of 370 acres, 600 acres and 310 acres respectively.

AAI has commenced the work on extension & strengthening of runway, taxiways & isolation bay and construction of New Terminal Building, ATC tower cum Fire Station, sub-station, new apron, boundary wall and associated work at Belgaum Airport.

AAI has recently constructed a new DVOR building and NDB building at Hubli Airport. AAI has also commenced the work on extension, strengthening & widening of runway, taxiways & isolation bay and construction of New Terminal Building, ATC tower cum Technical block cum Fire Station, sub-station, new apron and other ancillary buildings and services including perimeter road at Hubli Airport.

AAI has appointed IIT Delhi as a consultant for preparation of DPR for the runway extension work at Mysore airport.
