CORALS IN INDIAN OCEAN

3451. SHRI R. PARTHIPAN:

Will the Minister of EARTH SCIENCES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the corals especially in the Indian Ocean are prone to mass bleaching;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government has initiated or proposes to initiate any study/research in this regard; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the other steps taken/being taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND MINISTRY OF EARTH SCIENCES (SHRI Y. S. CHOWDARY)

- (a) Yes Madam.
- (b) There were instances of sporadic to mass bleaching of Indian corals in the past. Local oceanic processes, anthropogenic pressures, events like Indian Ocean Dipole/El Nino Southern Oscillation, etc. are few major driving mechanisms enforcing bleaching events.
- (c) & (d) The Ministry of Earth Sciences has been issuing satellite based Indian Coral Watch advisories on bi-weekly basis. The Ministry of Environment & Forests and Climate Change is also conducting studies to manage and conserve these fragile ecosystems.
