### SHORTAGE OF DOCTORS IN CGHS DISPENSARIES

# 4027. SHRI MOHITE PATIL VIJAYSINH SHANKARRAO: SHRI DHANANJAY MAHADIK:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is a huge shortage of doctors in Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) dispensaries, if so, the reasons therefor;

(b) the time by which the Government is likely to recruit more doctors;

(c) the time by which the Government is likely to provide round the clock emergency medical facility in all the CGHS dispensaries; and

(d) the time by which diagnostic laboratories are likely to be provided in CGHS dispensaries along with the details thereof?

# ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SMT. ANUPRIYA PATEL)

(a): There is some shortage of doctors in Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS).

Reasons for shortage of doctors in CGHS are as under:

(i) Accrual of vacancies due to transfer / superannuation / death etc.

(ii) Low rate of joining of Medical officers.

(iii) High attrition rate among Medical officers.

(b): Selection and joining of doctors is a continuous process, it is not possible to indicate any specific time frame in this regard.

(c): There is no such proposal. Government has already empanelled large number of private hospitals under CGHS and CGHS Beneficiaries can directly go to any of the private empanelled/private non-empanelled/government hospitals under medical emergency.

(d): There is no proposal at present to provide diagnostic laboratories in all CGHS Wellness Centres.
