PROMOTION OF ANCIENT LANGUAGES

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

- (a) the details of the languages which have been granted the status of ancient language in the country;
- (b) whether the Government has implemented any scheme regarding providing financial assistance through various projects for promotion of the ancient languages;
- (c) if so, the details thereof and the amount provided for promoting ancient languages during the last three years and the current year, language-wise;
- (d) whether the Government has received any proposal regarding projects related to ancient languages during the last three years; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

(a) to (e): There is no term called as 'ancient language' as recognised by the Government of India . The Government of India has initiated a Scheme known as "Protection and Preservation of Endangered Languages of India' (SPPEL). Under this scheme, the Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysore works on protection, preservation and documentation of the mother tongues/languages of India which are spoken by less than 10,000 people.

University Grants Commission (UGC) has formulated a scheme 'Establishment of Centres for Endangered Languages in Central Universities' under which the following amounts have been approved and released to seven Central Universities: -
