(a) & (b): The Indian Air Force (IAF) is equipped to cater for the threat environment that exists and is ready to meet the role assigned to it. Operational preparedness of IAF is reviewed from time to time based on the threat perception. Further augmentation of capabilities of IAF including its modernisation and acquisition is a dynamic and continuous process.

(c) & (d): Inter-Governmental Agreement with the Government of French Republic has been signed on 23.09.2016 for purchase of 36 Rafale aircraft along with requisite equipments, services and weapons. Cost of each Rafale aircraft is approximately Rs.670 crore and all the aircraft will be delivered by April 2022.
