USE OF COW DUNG IN BIO-TOILETS

553. SHRI GODSE HEMANT TUKARAM:

Will the Minister of DEFENCE j{kk ea=h be pleased to state:

(a) whether cow dung is being used in the bio-toilets developed by Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO);

(b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;

(c) whether use of cow dung in these bio-toilets is causing unpleasant smell and endangering flies and cockroaches; and

(d) if so, the details thereof and the corrective steps taken by the Government in this regard?

(a) & (b): Yes, Madam. Cow dung, being abundantly available at low cost, has been used for multiplication of bacteria used in the bio-digester.

(c) The cow dung is used only during multiplication of bacteria in the inoculums generation facility, which is a closed system. Once it is consumed by the bacteria, it is converted into a form that does not have any fly attractant property and rather detract them. Final bacteria fed into the bio-digester do not have any unpleasant odour and get washed away in the bio-digester within few days.

(d) At present, no additional measures are required to prevent them.
