# STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 35 FOR ANSWER ON 3.2.2017

(a) The details of schemes being implemented for the rehabilitation of Ex-Servicemen in the country are attached as Annexure 'A'.

(b) Resettlement training scheme of Directorate General of Resettlement is in vogue for the last four decades and has helped retiring / retired defence personnel in their resettlement in civil life.

Technical/Vocational/Management training is planned at various institutes. The yearly plan is notified. Individuals apply for courses as per their preference on a voluntary basis.

(c) & (d): Yes, Madam. Indian Institute of Management (IIMs) as well as other reputed institutes conduct 24 weeks certificate courses for retiring/retired officers of the Armed Forces, which assist them in taking up employment in the civil.

The following institutes conduct 24 weeks management courses for retiring/retired officers of the Armed Forces :-

- (i) Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad.
- (ii) Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow.
- (iii) Indian Institute of Management, Indore.
- (iv) Management Development Institute, Gurgaon.
- (v) Narsee Moonjee, Mumbai.
- (vi) Xavier Labour Relations Institute, Jamshedpur.
- (vii) Amity University, Noida.
- (viii) Alliance University, Bangalore.

**Resettlement Opportunities:** Ex-Servicemen are provided re-employment opportunities under the various schemes as mentioned in succeeding paragraphs.

#### 1. Job Opportunities For ESM In Central Government

#### (a) In Central Govt Ministries/Departments.

(i) 10% Direct recruitment posts upto the level of Asst Comdt in CPMF.

(ii) 10% Direct recruitment posts in Group £q

(iii) 20% Direct recruitment posts in Group Da

#### (b) In Central Public Sector Enterprise

#### 2. Placement Assistance through DGR

Directorate General Resettlement (DGR) sponsors Ex-Servicemen (Officers) to various Government organizations, Public Sector Undertakings, Corporate Houses, Private Sector, Central Para Military Forces etc based on their requisition for reemployment of ESM..

#### 3. DGR Sponsored Security Scheme

The DGR empanels / sponsors ESM run Private Security Agencies and State ESM Corporations for providing security guards to various CPSUs, Corporate Houses, Private sector Undertakings etc. .

#### 4. Schemes For Officers Only

ESM Coal Loading And Transportation Scheme. The Scheme is (i) administered on the basis of MoU between the Coal India Ltd (CIL) and DGR.

(ii) <u>Allotment of BPCL/IOCL COCO Outlets Pan India:</u> ESM (O) who is registered with DGR and has not availed any other benefit is sponsored for the COCO outlets in the state of choice given by ESM (O) based on Oil Company requisition.

(iii) <u>Management of CNG Station By ESM (O) In NCR</u>: Desirous ESM(O)s registered in the scheme are sponsored on receipt of requisition from IGL.

### 5. <u>Schemes For JCOs/OR Only:</u>

(i) <u>Allotment of Mother Dairy Milk Booths And Fruit & Vegetable</u> (Safal) Shops In <u>NCR</u>: The ESM register for Milk / SAFAL (Fruit and Vegetable booths separately and give multiple choice of zones for the purpose of areas where booths are required.

### 6. <u>Schemes for All:</u>

(i) <u>**Coal Tipper Attachment Scheme:**</u> This scheme is linked with the ESM Coal loading and transportation scheme.

(ii) <u>**Tipper attachment Scheme for War Widows and Disabled Soldiers**</u>: War widows upto age of 65 and disabled soldiers having 50% or more disability are also allowed to enrol for this scheme.

(iii) <u>Allotment of Army Surplus Vehicles:</u> ESM, widows and Ex-Servicemen Co-operative societies are eligible to apply for allotment of Army Surplus Class V-B Vehicles.

(iv) <u>Allotment of Regular LPG Distributor Ship</u>: War widows/dependents of those who died in war, war disabled/disabled on duty while serving in operational area, widows/dependents of those who died in harness due to attributable or aggravated causes to Military Service and ex-servicemen disabled in peace due to attributable or aggravated causes to Military Service are eligible.

(v) <u>LPG Agency Under Rajiv Gandhi Gramin LPG Vitrak (RGGLV)</u> <u>Scheme</u>: War widows/dependents of those who died in war, war disabled/disabled on duty while serving in operational area, widows/dependents of those who died in harness due to attributable or aggravated causes to Military Service and ex-servicemen disabled in peace due to attributable or aggravated causes to Military Service are eligible. (vi) <u>Retail Outlet Dealership (Petrol/Diesel)</u>: War widows/dependents of those who died in war, war disabled/disabled on duty while serving in operational area, widows/dependents of those who died in harness due to attributable or aggravated causes to Military Service and ex-servicemen disabled in peace due to attributable or aggravated causes to Military Service are eligible.

# 7. <u>Training:</u>

(i) **Officers' Training**:- DGR imparts Resettlement training to the retiring officer /Ex-Servicemen (Officer) in various institutes Pan India.

(ii) <u>JCOs/OR and Equivalents' Training at Institutes</u>:- DGR imparts Resettlement training to the retiring JCOs/OR /Ex-Servicemen (JCOs/OR) in various institutes Pan India.

**8.** A placement cell has been opened at Directorate of Air Veterans. Retiring Air Warriors can register their names for better re-employment opportunity.

**9.** As per recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), IAF in consultation with National Skill Development Corporation is conducting skill certificate courses for retiring air warriors to facilitate post retirement employment in civil industry.

11. <u>Modified Scooter Grant</u>: Rupees 57,500/- provides to those ESM, who are disabled after service with a disability of 50% or more and who are not covered under the scheme of AG s Branch of IHQ (Army, Navy & Air Force).

12. <u>Tool Kit of Ex-servicemen Technicians</u>: Tool Kits are provided at a cost not exceeding Rupees 8,000/- subject to fulfilling the following conditions :-

(a) The individual holds the qualifications to utilize the tool kits.

(b) The individual has the appropriate infrastructure to set up for himself the proposed trade.

# 14. Financial support to States for ESM welfare :-

(a) <u>Special category States</u>: 75% of the expenditure on establishment of RSBs/ZSBs is shared by the Centre to the special category States i.e Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, Uttarakhand, Jammu & Kashmir and Himachal Pradesh.

(b) **Balance States**: 60% of the expenditure on establishment of RSBs/ZSBs is shared by the Centre to the balance of the States.

15. **Prime Minister's Scholarship Scheme**: For financially supporting degree level professional education for the wards of War widows (all ranks) and ESM (PBOR) including ex Coast Guard personnel. Total 5500 scholarship are provided to eligible wards based on merit for the entire duration of the courses. Priority is given to the wards of War widows/War disabled Soldiers. The rates of Scholarship are as follows : -

- (a) Rs. 2000/- per month for boys.
- (b) Rs. 2250/- per month for girls.
