PLANTATION PROGRAMME FOR REJUVENATION OF GANGA RIVER

Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES, RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND GANGA REJUVENATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has finalized a massive plantation programme for river landspace for rejuvenation of Ganga river through the intervention of States;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the cost likely to be incurred along with the cost sharing pattern; and

(d) the other modalities worked out for the programme?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR YOUTH AFFAIRS & SPORTS AND MINISTER OF STATE FOR WATER RESOURCES, RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND GANGA REJUVENATION (SHRI VIJAY GOEL)

(a) & (b) The forestry interventions are an integral activity of the larger programme on Ganga Rejuvenation (Namami Gange) initiated by the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG).

A Detailed Project Report (DPR) on forestry interventions for Ganga has been prepared by Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehradun. The DPR adopts a multifaceted approach including afforestation.

A river scape covering an area of 83,946 km² has been delineated all along the basin in the five Ganga River bank states namely, Uttrakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand and West Bengal.

(c) The Phase-1 of the project is to be implemented over a five years period from financial year 2016-2017 to 2020-2021. The total projected financial outlay over 5 years is Rs. 2293.73 Crores. Namami Gange Programmes are fully funded by the Central Government.

(d) For the year 2016 -17, Annual Plans of Operation (APO) were prepared by forest department of Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand and West Bengal. As per these plans, NMCG sanctioned a sum of Rs. 50.63 crore to the five Ganga river bank states for plantation for the year 2016-17. For the year 2017-18, NMCG has sent request letters to the concerned states to submit their APO, so that the funding can be sanctioned well before the plantation season.
