Pace of SBM

1278. ADV. M. UDHAYAKUMAR:

Will the Minister of **DRINKING WATER AND SANITATION** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has put the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM-G) under the scanner for a critical review of all central schemes by a Group of Secretaries;
- (b) whether the pace of SBM is slow and if so, the steps proposed to be taken by the Union Government thereon;
- (c) whether the Government has started brainstorming workshops to take stock of the progress of the SBM-G and expedite the achievements of sanitation in a sustainable manner; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) Different Groups of Secretaries have been constituted to make recommendations for various Central schemes, including Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin).

(b) No, Madam. Against the expected outcome of **50 lakh** individual latrines for the year 2014-15, **58,54,987** latrines were constructed, which is an achievement of **117%** of the target. During 2015-16, **127.41 lakh** toilets were constructed against expected outcome of **120.00 lakh**. For the year **2016-17**, against the expected outcome of **1.5 crore** individual latrines, **1,55,16,257** individual latrines (**103.44%**) have been constructed as on **06-02-2017**.

Sanitation Coverage, which was **42.05%** on **2.10.2014**, has increased to **60.32%** on **06.02.2017**. A total of **156219** Villages, **70275** Gram Panchayats, **909** Blocks and **87** District have declared themselves as Open Defecation Free (ODF) as on **06.02.2017**.

(c)-(d) Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation regularly organises various brainstorming and capacity building workshops for Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin). These include State/Regional/National workshops with various stakeholders and implementers to provide technical guidance, identify challenges, find solutions, and share good practices.
