# ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) FOR YOUTH AFFAIRS & SPORTS (SHRI VIJAY GOEL)

(a) The details of training institutions along with the provisions of sports education for promotion of sports in the country, State/UT-wise are provided at Annexure - I.

- (b) The Ministry of Youth Affairs is not implementing any Centrally Sponsored Scheme for promotion of sports, sports education and training institutions in the country, at present. The "Khelo India National Programme for Development of Sports" Scheme being implemented by the Ministry for the current financial year, 2016-17, for creation of sports infrastructure, conduct of annual sports competitions and identification of sporting talent, is a Central Sector Scheme.

## Details of training institutions along with the provisions of sports education for promotion of sports in the country

#### A. Netaji Subhas National, Institute of Sports, Patiala (under SAI)

- 1. The National Institute of Sports was set up by the Govt. of India on 7<sup>th</sup>May 1961 to herald an era of systematic and scientific sports coaching in the country. It became Academic Division of Sports Authority of India w.e.f. 1<sup>th</sup>May 1987. It is considered as a premier sports Institute in Asia and is located at Moti Bagh Palace, Patiala (Punjab) with a total area of 268 Acres.
- 2. Aims & Objectives of the Institute
- To conduct short & long term academic courses in sports coaching, sports sciences and other related fields.
- To raise the competence of the coaches through organization of Refresher Courses for Coaches.
- To provide assistance to National Sports Federations for conducting National Coaching Camps for international competitions.
- To provide scientific back-up to the elite sportspersons for achievement of high level performance.
- To organize conferences, seminars and workshops, on sports related subjects.
- To serve as a source of information and counseling on sports infrastructure through experts.
- To implement Sports Promotional Schemes of SAI.
- To identify sports talent in identified disciplines and to groom them through scientific sports coaching for achievement of excellence in sports.
- To implement the sports promotion schemes of the MYA&S.
- 3. The Following Academic Programmes are run in the Institute:
- (i) Certificate Course in Sports Coaching (6 Weeks).
- (ii) Diploma Course In Sports Coaching (10 months).
- (iii) Master's Course in Sports Coaching.
- 4. The Institute also provides scientific support to National Camps and Sports Authority of India (SAI) Schemes.

## B. <u>Lakshmibai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE)</u>, <u>Thiruvananthapuram (under SAI)</u>

- 1. The Lakshmibai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE), Kariavattom, Thiruvananthapuram, was set up on 17<sup>th</sup> August, 1985 under the then Deptt. of Youth Affairs & Sports, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India.
- 2. Aims & Objectives
- i. To prepare highly competent and skilled leaders, teachers, coaches, scholars and administrators in the field of physical education, sports and games as well as associated areas.
- ii. To serve as a Centre of Excellence for research in physical education and allied areas.
- iii. To provide technical, professional and academic leadership to other institutions of physical education elsewhere in India and abroad.
- iv. To provide vocational guidance and placement services to people in the field
- v. To develop and promote programmes of mass physical education activity.
- vi. To provide infrastructure, board and lodging facilities for State and National level Coaching Camps as well as make this College a hub of ongoing schemes of SAI.
- 3. Academic Programmes run by the College:
- (i) Certificate Courses (6 weeks)
- (ii) Bachelor of Physical Education (4 years)
- (iii) Master of Physical Education (2 years)
- (iv) Master of Philosophy (M. Phil) (1 Year)
- (v) Regular and Part-time Ph.D. Programme
- (vi) NIS Diploma in Sports Coaching
- 4. The College also conducts National Coaching Camps.

#### C. Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education, Gwalior

The Institute is an autonomous organization under the administrative control of this Ministry and is fully funded by the Government of India. It is a Society registered under the Madhya Pradesh Societies' Registration Act, 1973. The Union Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports is the President of the Institute.

2. The Institute is at Gwalior. This is a co-educational and fully residential institute which primarily conducts regular degree courses in Physical Education and offers 4 year degree - B.P. Ed (Bachelor of Physical Education) and 2 year Post Graduate degree - Master of Physical Education. It also offers M. Phil. and Doctorate in the field of Physical Education. The Institute attracts student from abroad also.

- 3. In addition to the regular degree courses as above, the Institute is also running P.G. Diploma Courses in (i) Sports Coaching, (ii) Fitness Management Sports, (iii) Yoga and Alternate Therapy; and (iv) Diploma in Sports Coaching during the reporting year.
- 4. The Institute has opened its North East Off-campus at Guwahati (Assam). The first batch of students admitted during the academic session 2009-10 for NERC, Guwahati had its campus at Gwalior itself, while the Institute commenced its academic program of B P Ed 1<sup>st</sup> year and 2<sup>nd</sup> year at Tepesia Sports Complex in the year 2010-11 after making certain alterations and maintenance of the built-up structures there in the manner best possible for the Institute.
- 5. The Institute has the following Departments:-
  - (i) Department of Physical Education Pedagogy
  - (ii) Department of Exercise Physiology
  - (iii) Department of Sports Psychology
  - (iv) Department of Sports Biomechanics
  - (v) Department of Health Sciences & Fitness.
- 5.A. In addition to above Departments, the Institute has following two centers:
  - (i) Center for Advanced Studies
  - (ii) Center for Sports Coaching & Management.
- 6. The Institute has been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC- an autonomous body of University Grant Commission) with 'B' Grade (CGPA- 2.98 out of 4), which is valid for a period of 5 years from 28.3.2010. The Institute has been certified to the parameters of the ISO:9001. The Institute has also been certified by fulfilling all the laid criteria of "Integrated Management System (IMS)" for its quality teaching, learning, training and research in Physical Education, Sports and allied areas. The students of the Institute have achieved medals in the National and International games.
- 7. The Institute has adequate infrastructural and play-field facilities to cater to the academic requirements of the students as well as their residential needs and staff members of all categories.

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
