EXPLORATION OF MINERALS BY GSI

1406 . SHRI OM BIRLA :

Will the Minister of MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that only about 13% of the country's 575,000 square kilometers of land with geological potential has been explored, if so, the details and facts thereof ;
- (b) the exploration carried out by Geological Survey of India (GSI) during the last three years for Gold and the progress achieved as a result of the same , State-wise ; and
- (c) the quantum of funds allocated, released and utilized for carrying out exploration activities in the country, State /mineral -wise?

A N S W E R

(a): Geological Survey of India [GSI] has covered almost the entire area of 31.4 lakh sq. km. of the country's mappable area by systematic geological mapping on 1:50,000 scale. On the basis of this, the geological potential area of 5.71 lakh sq. km. (Obvious Geological Potential) has been identified for scheduled minerals except non-coal fuel minerals. Further, GSI has launched National Geochemical Mapping (NGCM) and National Geophysical Mapping (NGPM) programs. Of the identified obvious geological potential area, GSI has covered 3.17 lakh sq km and 1.9 lakh sq km by NGCM and NGPM respectively. Private and public mineral exploration agencies launch mineral exploration programmes based on the above baseline data.

(b): During the last three years GSI has carried out gold exploration work in the states of Rajasthan, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Andhra Pradesh and Arunachal Pradesh. As a result of the exploration work of GSI, 9.8 million tonnes of gold resources were established in the state of Rajasthan (6.78 mt), Jharkhand (2 mt) and Karnataka (1.02 mt) during the field seasons 2012 -13, 2013 -14 and 2014 -15.

(c): The details of funds allocated and utilized by GSI for mineral exploration activities in the country during the last three years (up to January 2017) is given below:
