Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken note of shabby treatment accorded to the world cup winning Kabaddi team on their return to the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken against those held responsible;
- (c) whether such instances of mistreatment of athletes winning international events have been recurring in the country;
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the reasons therefor; and
- (e) the steps being taken by the Government to formulate a policy to honour such athletes in the country who win laurels in international events?
