FUNDS RAISED THROUGH BONDS IN NHAI

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has spent over Rs.30,000 crore out of the total plan allocation of Rs.55,000 crore;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether this excludes National Highways Authority of India (NHAI)'s spending from borrowings and fund raised through bonds; and
- (d) if so, the details of the NHAI spending during the current financial year?

(a) to (d) The total plan allocation of the Ministry during 2016-17 at Budget Estimate (BE) stage was Rs.55,000 crore. The allocation has been reduced to Rs.49301.10 crore under 2016-17 Revised Estimate (RE). This includes an allocation/release of Rs.13,826.50 crore made to the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) during 2016-17 so far.

The total plan expenditure incurred/release of funds made during 2016-17 upto the month ending February, 2017 was Rs.38440.77 crore (Provisional).

Apart from the gross budgetary support (GBS) of Rs.13,826.50 crore earmarked to NHAI so far during 2016-17, NHAI has raised an amount of Rs.28,212 crore upto February, 2017 as Internal and Extra Budgetary Resources (IBER).

NHAI has incurred a total expenditure of Rs.44,297.11 crore upto the month ending February, 2017 during 2016-17.
