- (b) if so, the details thereof, item-wise and country-wise;
- (c) whether the Union Government proposes to increase the production of raw materials for textile sector in the country; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

(a) & (b): No, the import of raw material for textile production has decreased at a CAGR of 0.2% from 2013 to 2015. The item-wise and country-wise details of import of raw material of textiles are as follows:
