These include sustained image projection, participation in career fairs and exhibitions and publicity campaign to create awareness among the youth on the advantages of taking up a challenging and satisfying career. Further, Government has taken various steps to make armed forces' jobs attractive. These include additional family accommodation through Married Accommodation Project (MAP) and improvement in promotion prospects in the Armed Forces.
