(a) whether the Indian Air Force (IAF) is having shortage of pilots for its fighter planes and if so, the details thereof;

(b) whether IAF already had allowed pilots who were earlier declared unfit to fly fighter planes;

(c) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;

(d) whether the Government proposes to include all experienced pilots for the fighter planes of IAF irrespective of medical conditions of the pilots and if so, the details thereof; and

(e) whether the Government has any plan to generate a new cadre of pilots for IAF by introducing higher packages for new and young entrants instead of reinstating physically doubtful pilots and if so, the details thereof?
