(a) As per the information available with Indian Bureau of Mines, the State-wise reserves/resources of Diamond in the country as on 01.04.2013 are given in the following table:-

(b) & (c) No potential zones have been <u>earmarked</u> by National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI). However, some exploratory studies have been carried out by CSIR-NGRI on kimberlites of Dharwar, Bastar and Singhbhum regions which Preliminary studies suggest that a corridor covering parts of the Bastar and the Eastern Dharwar craton could be suitable for diamond prospectivity.
