**WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT IN LWE AFFECTED REGIONS**

248. SHRIMATI KIRRON KHER:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether special schemes have been implemented for women and child development in Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected regions;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the funds allocated/released and utilized thereunder during each of the last three years and current year, State/UT-wise; and
- (c) the present status of these schemes?

**ANSWER**

- (a) to (c): No Madam. However, the Ministry of Women and Child Development is implementing various schemes/programmes for empowerment of women and child development through Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) across the country including left wing extremism affected regions. These are as follows:
  - i. Swadhar Greh to provide relief and rehabilitation to destitute women and women in distress;
  - ii. Support to Training and Employment Programme for Women (STEP) to ensure sustainable employment and income generation for marginalized and asset-less rural and urban poor women across the country;
  - iii. Rajiv Gandhi National Creche Scheme to provide day care facilities to children of age group of 6 months to 6 years of working women who are employed.
  - iv. Ujjawala a Comprehensive Scheme for prevention of trafficking and rescue, rehabilitation and re-integration of victims of trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation.
  - v. Rastriya Mahila Kosh (RMK) to extend micro-finance services to bring about socio-economic upliftment of poor women;
  - vi. Working Women Hostels for ensuring safe accommodation for women working away from their place of residence;
  - vii. National Mission for Empowerment of Women (NMEW) to strengthen the overall processes that promote all round development of Women;
  - viii. Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls-Sabla for all-round development of adolescent girls of 11-18 years by making them self-reliant by facilitating access to learning, health and nutrition;
  - ix. Matritva Sahayog Yojana (IGMSY) has been contributing towards better enabling environment by providing cash incentives for improved health and nutrition to pregnant and nursing mothers;

- x. Schemes of One Stop Centre and Universalisation of Women Helpline are being implemented to provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence;
- xi. Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme;
- xii. Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS)
