### **QUESTION**

#### Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) the estimated capacity of the currency printing press to print currency notes per year; and
- (b) the total value and number of currency notes of Rs. 1000 and Rs. 500 deposited and the new currency of Rs. 2000 and Rs. 500 circulated upto 31.01.2017?

# <u>ANSWER</u> MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY FOR FINANCE (SHRI ARJUN RAM MEGHWAL)

(a): The estimated capacity of the currency printing presses is about 24 billion banknotes per year.

(b): As of December 10, 2016, the Specified Bank Notes of Rs. 500 and Rs. 1000 returned to RBI and currency chests amounted to Rs. 12.44 lakh crores. The data obtained in this regard would need to be reconciled with the physical cash balances to eliminate counterfeit notes, accounting errors/ possible double counts etc., after which only the final figures will be arrived at. As on January27, 2017, the notes in circulation amounted to Rs. 9.921 lakh crores.
