Subramaniam Committee Report

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has prepared a roadmap for the successful implementation of the Subramaniam Committee's report formed for chalking out the essential measures for improving the Health of Education Sector in India in a time-bound manner;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the concrete steps taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to garner the support of State Governments in the successful realisation of recommendations made by the Committee?

(a) to (c): Presently, the Government is in the process of formulating a New Education Policy (NEP) for which it carried out exhaustive consultations.

The Ministry had constituted a 5-member Committee for Evolution of the New Education Policy on 31st October 2015 under the Chairmanship of Shri T.S.R. Subramanian, former Cabinet Secretary to the Government of India. The Committee submitted its report on the 27th May, 2016. Further, after perusal of the report of the Committee and the recommendations from various consultations as well as other views and comments received, 'Some inputs for the Draft National Education Policy, 2016' has been formulated on which comments/suggestions were invited.

Several suggestions, views, comments and inputs have been received from different cross-sections of society. An 'Education Dialogue' was also organized with the Hon'ble MPs to elicit their views. The process of finalizing the National Education Policy (NEP) is likely to take some more time.
