Will the Minister of MINORITY AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has launched minority cyber gram project aimed at training the villagers to become Internet Savvy and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the project has been shelved by the Government and if so, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Government will take necessary steps to revive the minority cyber gram project and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the other steps taken by the Government to establish more such minority cyber gram projects in other parts of the country?

<u>ANSWER</u> MINISTER OF STATE(INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF MINORITY AFFAIRS (SHRI MUKHTAR ABBAS NAQVI)

(a) to (d): A pilot project for `Minority Cyber Gram`` was launched in February, 2014 for digital literacy in a minority dominated village Chandauli, District Alwar, Rajasthan. The Ministry has mainstreamed the Cyber Gram project with the Multi-sectoral Development Programme as a special initiative. Under this initiative students of minority communities are provided hands on training in computers to enable them to acquire basic Information and Communication Technology (ICT) skills; become digitally literate; actively participate in knowledge based activities; access financial, social and government services and use internet for communications. The initiative covers students of Class VI to Class X belonging to notified minority communities(Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Buddhists, Parsis and Jains)residing in minority concentration areas indentified under Multi-sectoral Development Programme.(MsDP). MsDP being a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, the projects are approved on the basis of requirement and proposal received from State/UTs.
