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## STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (c) OF LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 3872 FOR ANSWER ON 24.3.2017

1. The total Value of Production of Defence Public Sector Undertakings (DPSUs) and Ordnance Factory Board (OFB) for the year 2015-16 and 2016-17 (upto Dec 2016) is Rs. 52,968 crore and Rs. 32,379 crore respectively. The data on the quantum of production by Indian private defence companies is not maintained.

2. The expenditure on purchase of defence equipment through imports for the three Services i.e Army, Navy &Air Force, has been approximately 34.30% and 41.60% for the year 2015-16 & 2016-17 (upto Dec 2016) respectively.

3. Various public and private sector companies viz. Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL), Mishra Dhatu Nigam, M/s Jindal Steel Ltd, M/s Essar Steel etc. have evinced interest for development of special grade steel, including import substitution, for use in manufacture of defence items / equipment. OFB and DPSUs have accordingly been advised to meet the requirements of steel through indigenous sources to the extent possible.

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
