Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is importing huge quantity of paper used for printing of currency notes:
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the amount spent for the same during the last three years and the current year;
- (c) whether any proposal is under consideration of the Government to set up manufacturing facilities for indigenous production of papers used for printing of currency notes in the country; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the time by which such units are likely to be set up and the estimated cost savings as a result thereof?

(c) & (d): One Bank Note Paper line at Security Paper Mill (SPM), Hoshangabad under the aegis of Secruity Printing and Minting Corporation of India Limited (SPMCIL) and two lines at Bank Note Paper Mill India Private Limited (BNPMIPL), a joint venture Bharatiya Reserve Bank Note Mudran Private Limited (BRBNMPL) and SPMCIL, are operational and supplying paper for banknote printing.
