Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has established Special Study Centres for the benefit of disabled, Scheduled Caste (SC)/ Scheduled Tribe (ST), women, Other Backward Classes (OBCs) and other minority community students and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government is aware that IGNOU is cancelling/suspending operations of many such Special Study Centres without any prior notice causing a lot of difficulties to the said disadvantaged students; and
- (c) if so, the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

(a) to (c): As per the information furnished by Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), the university has established 697 Special Study Centres for the benefit of disadvantaged learners across 56 Regional Centres in the Country. The details are provided in the table below:
