Mining Projects in Forests

4329. SHRI SANTOKH SINGH CHAUDHARY:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) the percentage of forests under mining projects in the country at present;
- (b) whether the Government is aware of the report by Forest Survey of India (FSI) in August, 2016, stating that mining should be barred in 40% of India's forests;
- (c) whether the Government has adopted a new comprehensive policy to identify and protect 'inviolate forests' post the Supreme Court judgement cancelling licenses of 204 coal blocks in September, 2014;
- (d) whether the Government use the same parameters as FSI for approving projects and if not, the reason therefore;
- (e) whether the Government's parameters for 'inviolate forests' has changed since 2014;
- (f) whether the said parameters still include measuring forest cover, forest type, landscape integrity, biological richness, wildlife value and hydrological importance; and
- (g) if not, whether the parameters have been diluted to acess more resources for development and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

- (a) Approximately, 134156 Ha. forest land has been diverted for mining purpose since 1980 which is about 0.18% of total recorded forest area of the country.
- (b) & (c) No Sir.
- (d) A web based decision support system developed by FSI is also utilized while considering the proposals in the Ministry.
- (e), (f) & (g) Information on forest cover, forest type, landscape integrity, biological richness, wildlife and hydrological importance is integral part of decision support system developed by FSI.
