(a) & (b): Overall, Railways are making losses on passenger operations every year. The losses incurred on this account in the last 5 years are as under.

Year	Losses (₹ in crore)
2011-12	23932
2012-13	26831
2013-14	32067
2014-15	33491
2015-16	35918

The losses incurred on account of passengers' fare are not separately maintained.

(c): Evaluation of various alternatives relating to rationalisation of passenger fare structure is an on-going process. In case of new trains such as Humsafar and Antyodaya Express, dynamic fare structure has been introduced to increase earnings. Flexi fare scheme has also earlier been introduced in Rajdhani, Shatabdi and Duronto train w.e.f. 09.09.2016. Railways also run special trains on special charges over and above the normal time tabled trains. Suvidha trains with variable fares run over and above the normal time-tabled trains to meet surge in demand during peak seasons, holiday seasons and festivals.
