### **Minimum Import Price of Aluminium**

#### 4630 SHRIMATI VANAROJA R:

Will the Minister of **MINES** be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government is aware that primary aluminium producers incurred losses of around Rs.4,025 crore in the last fiscal substantially higher than Rs.1,480 crore during 2014-15 and if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;

(b) whether China is exporting surplus quantities of aluminium to India amid weak domestic demand and if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether the Government is considering to take up this matter for imposing minimum import price on aluminium to protect the domestic industry; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

#### ANSWER

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (I/C) MINES, COAL, NEW AND RENEWABLE ENERGY AND POWER (SHRI PIYUSH GOYAL)

- (a) As per study report on assessment of Minimum Import Price (MIP) for Aluminium in India, prepared by MECON Ltd., a Government of India enterprise, loss of primary aluminium producers was Rs.943/- crore during financial year 2014-15 which increased to Rs.4,283/- crore during financial year 2015-16. The reason behind this was an increase in production cost and slump in London Metal Exchange (LME) price of aluminium from average USD 2,317.50/MT in 2011-12 to USD 1591.82/MT in 2015-16.
- (b) There was an increase in import from China amid weak domestic demand. The details are given as under :
