(a) & (b): Yes, Madam. Re-settlement training courses are being conducted for retiring personnel of Armed Forces since more than four decades. A Memorandum of Understanding between Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship has been signed on 13th July, 2015. Resettlement training of Directorate General Resettlement

(DGR) has now been linked to:

- (i) National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) based skill training for Ex-servicemen.
- (ii) Assessment and certification by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) NSDC Certification will equip Exservicemen with required standards and better certification which would help them in securing suitable jobs in Government / Private sector.
- (iii) Placement linked training with NSQF skill based training and Common Norms, placement of trainees is expected to improve substantially.
- (c) Resettlement courses are being conducted in Government as well as private training institutes that are certified by NSDC.
- (d) 55 private training institutes were engaged for skill training in Financial Year 2016-17.
- (e) No, Madam, there is no such proposal at present.
