IMPACT OF LIQUOR RESTRICTION ON TOURISM SECTOR

10. PROF. SAUGATA ROY:

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that restrictions on liquor has impacted the tourism sector and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the average growth of the number of foreign tourists and domestic tourists since the last three years after the ban on liquor in some States;
- (c) whether the Government intends to introduce a national liquor policy;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons for not introducing a national liquor policy?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TOURISM (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) (DR. MAHESH SHARMA)

(a) and (b): No, Madam. However, there has been a growth in the number of Foreign Tourist Arrivals (FTAs) to India and domestic tourist visits during the last three years which is as under:

2016	8.80	1614

FTAs during the period January to May 2017 was 42,15,351* registering a growth of 16.4% compared to the same period 2016.
