Vocational Courses

1168. SHRIMATI KIRRON KHER:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) Whether the Government proposes vocational courses mainly in Technical Education; and
- (b) If so, whether the Government has made any prospective plan/proposal received to integrate vocational courses suggested by any organization with the present educational system with regard to streams other than technical streams?

ANSWER

(a): The AICTE has been implementing the following schemes in technical institutions for upgrading the skills of the unemployed youth:

- i. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojna for Technical Institutions (PMKVY-TI) in which 30,457 out of school students have been enrolled in 661 Institutes/Polytechnics for imparting technical skills.
- ii. Community College scheme implemented in 200 pilot Community Colleges which offer credit based courses, which allows multipoint entry and exit for skill up-gradation or employment market.
- iii. National Employability Enhancement Mission (NEEM) to offer on-the-job practical training to enhance employability of a person either pursuing his or her graduation/diploma in any technical or non-technical stream to increase their employability. Till date, 12 NEEM facilitators are registered under NEEM Scheme.

(b): Whereas no such plan is in place, the Government is open to ideas in integrating vocational courses with technical education.
