Will the Minister of **COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has made any assessment on the progress and success of the 'Make in India' programme in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof including the total Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) inflow and number of jobs generated therefrom under the programme during each of the last three years and the current year, sector-wise and State/UT-wise;
- (c) whether the Ministry was consulted before finalizing the newly introduced Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Regulation of Livestock Markets) Rules, 2017;
- (d) if so, whether the Ministry informed the concerned authority about its consequences and adverse impact on leather industry especially leather export wherein millions of people are employed; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof along with the corrective steps taken by the Government in this regard especially with respect to the possible impact on the leather industry?

- (a) & (b):** The 'Make in India' is not a programme but an initiative launched in 2014, which aims at promoting India as an important investment destination and a global hub in manufacturing, design and innovation. 'Make in India' initiative aims to create a conducive environment for

investment, development of modern and efficient infrastructure, opening up new sectors for foreign investment and forging a partnership between Government and industry through a positive mind set. Employment generation is influenced by a range of domestic and international factors, including enabling policies such as 'Make in India'. Government has been taking steps to boost employment generation in the country. However, no specific assessment of jobs generated under this initiative has been undertaken.

Sector-wise and State/UT-wise classification of the total FDI inflow based on the programme/ initiative is not maintained. However, sector-wise & region-wise (One regional office may have one or more states) details of FDI equity inflow reported during the last three years and the current financial year, as maintained, are at Annexure –I & II respectively.

**(c) to (e):** Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion, as per Government of India (Allocation of Business Rules) 1961 deals with Leather & Leather Goods Industry. The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Regulation of Livestock Markets) Rules, 2017 was notified by Government in the Gazette of India on 23.05.2017. The notification was stayed by Madurai Bench of Madras High Court vide order dated 30.05.2017. A Writ Petition (Civil) No. 000422 of 2017 titled All India Jamiatul Quresh Action Committee Through its President Mohammed Abdul Faheem Advocate Vs Union of India was filed in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The Hon'ble Supreme Court vide order dated 11.07.2017 observed that the stay granted by the Madurai Bench of Madras High Court vide order dated 30.05.2017 in Writ Petition (MD) No. 7769 &7771 and 10128 &10129 to the operation of rules shall apply to the whole country. Thus, the operation of the notification dated 23.05.2017 has been stayed by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. So the question of impact of Notification on leather industry does not arise.
